## How to use this document

Communicating with and providing information for people with disability is vital in creating an accessible and inclusive experience, and it's good for your business! People with disability need to plan their travel in detail as there are many potential barriers that could prevent full participation and dignified enjoyment.

By providing as much information as possible, people with disability can then make an informed decision on whether your activity is the right one for them and if what has been put in place will meet their accessibility requirements.

So, how do you make sure you are communicating the useful information for people with disability? You can use the following resource to answer questions about your venue and place this information on your website.

Don't stress if your activity currently isn't completely accessible from the get-go, total accessibility is a process that takes time. Providing information on what you currently have in place ensures people with disability can make informed decisions about their visit.

Do you cater for people with a disability? What adjustments are available to make activities accessible?

Yes, we do. The tour is held on a 386 m long bushland boardwalk with a ramp and turn around point. Afternoon and Morning Tea can be served on the boardwalk for easier access.

Describe in detail the activities that are available to people with disability

Guided Bushtucker and Bush Medicine Tour, approx. 1.5 hour on the boardwalk followed by morning or afternoon tea. I would like to invite you to fully immerse yourself in a truly unique experience on the Discovery Coast. Our 44-acre bush property is located within the Goreng Goreng Nation, just outside of Agnes Water/1770 and I live here with my beautiful wife and two young boys.

"BushTracks" takes you on a journey through native Australian bushland, rich with Bushtucker and Bush Medicines. Learn about traditional and cultural uses of plants, embark on a journey through past and present and learn about cultural burning practices protecting our land. Several native beehives keep the diversity of our plants thriving all year round.

Wildlife habitats can be seen on the peaceful walk through our ever-changing bushland. The vast variety of native trees inhabit over 60 species of birds. Bring your binoculars – you never know which bird you might spot on the day!

Stop for a minute and give yourself the opportunity to truly immerse in nature!

After an informative walk under the canopy of tall gumtrees, you will enjoy a delicious cup of local, organic Tielka Tea, accompanied by Wattle Seed Choc Chip Cookies and Davidson Plum Slice from Dreamtime Tuka – a majority owned Aboriginal company located in NSW. Entice your taste buds by sampling an array of Australian made native spreads supplied by Kurrajong Australian Native Foods.

Listen to the sounds of the birds, the wind in the trees and reflect on the experience you've just had!

We work closely with local organizations like Tangaroa Blue, Australian Native Bee Association and Tielka Tea to promote sustainable practices within our business.

We won't be leaving the step-free boardwalk during the tour.
